

# School Performance & Transferability Facts

In 2007-2008, Weimar College graduated 6 students in the following areas: Religious Ministries (1), General Studies (2), Massage Therapy (3). One Religious Ministries graduate was hired as a frontline missions president. One General Studies graduate was hired as a literature evangelist. One Massage Therapy graduate was hired as a massage therapist, one continued their previous employment as a traveling nurse, and one continued further studies.

Weimar College supports the work of the Seventh-day Adventist Church and trains its students for servant leadership in positions of ministry, health, massage therapy and more. Weimar College welcomes students who enroll with the intent to spend a year or two with us and then transfer to other Seventh-day Adventist colleges and universities.

## Notice Concerning Transferability of Units and Degrees Earned at Weimar College

Weimar College has been granted approval from the Bureau for Private Post-secondary and Vocational Education. The Bureau's approval means that the institution and its operation comply with the standards established under the law for private post-secondary educational institutions. The approval is not a form of endorsement or accreditation.

The College is also affiliated with Griggs University. Griggs University is accredited by the Distance Education and Training Council, an agency approved by the United States Department of Education. Through the affiliation students will receive Griggs University credits for courses taken at Weimar. Students who apply to Griggs University receive a degree audit and may need to take additional classes to complete a diploma from Griggs University. Students who wish to transfer their credits earned at Weimar to another college can request a Griggs University transcript.

The curriculum of the college provides for students who wish to complete a two or four year degree, and for students who wish to begin their education here and then transfer to other colleges or universities to complete their degree. Units earned at Weimar College will, in most cases, be transferable to other Seventh-day Adventist colleges and universities. However, in most other cases, these units will probably not be transferable to any other college or university.

For example, if you entered our school as a freshman, you will still be a freshman if you enter another college or university at some time in the future even though you earned units here at our school. In addition, if you earned a degree, diploma, or certificate at Weimar College, it will probably not serve as a basis for obtaining a higher level degree at another college or university, other than Seventh-day Adventist universities, although there have been exceptions to this.
